Message: Making a Choice

The Legend of two wolves.

An old Cherokee elder is teaching his grandson about life.

"A fight is going on inside me," he said to the boy.

"It is a terrible fight and it is between two wolves.

One is evil – he is anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego."

He continued,

"The other is good – he is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith.

The same fight is going on inside you – and inside every other person, too."

The grandson thought about it for a minute and then asked his grandfather,

"Which wolf will win?"

The old Cherokee simply replied, "The one you feed."

In the scripture this morning from Galatians, the apostle Paul is restating to the people of Galatia that life in Christ brings freedom from the bondage of rules the Jewish laws and ceremonies had in place.

He continues by making it clear that Christian freedom is not unconditional permission to do whatever you please but reminds the early followers of "the way" to not use your freedom as an opportunity

for self-indulgence. Instead, use your freedom to create a life of loving service to the benefit of others (to love your neighbour as yourself). No matter what their gender, skin colour, language spoken or religion practised.

Freedom to love and serve in the example of Jesus is God's intention for humankind.

Freedom is a gift from God given to all through faith.

Like all good gifts, though it can be misused and even cause harm. For example, Christians thinking that they are better than others and dominating decision making that has negative outcomes on lives. (the residential school system Is an example of how Christian people dominated another culture which has been classified as genocide).

On the other hand, people who love and serve others unconditionally can also be taken advantage of and abused. (Our news headlines are full of warnings about telephone or online scams that steal money from people who think they are helping someone less fortunate).

The apostle Paul tries to distinguish between self-centred living that stems from pleasing of the "flesh" and God-centred living which comes from the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. He provides two lists as a guideline:

On one side you have what we may refer to in today's culture as people who are materialistic and place a lot of value on self-satisfaction and overindulgences, which may lead to addictions. They are the people whose motto is: "You only live once, so I try to say yes to everything – at least once"!

The list Paul prepared doesn't mean you can't have sex, attend parties or enjoy a glass of wine. He is warning about the excessiveness of these behaviours when they consume your life. The natural desire of sexual intimacy becomes an addiction to pornography; wanting a close relationship with the Divine leads to creating idols to worship; wanting happiness and a good time in your life, is only found if you use drugs to create the feelings you desire.

The other list is what we know as "the fruits of the spirit". Characteristics and qualities of people who truly try to follow the golden rule of "love your neighbour".

The apostle Paul is adamant that the early Christians live by the spirit, be led by the spirit and walk by the spirit.

How can we apply these principles to our faith walk today?

- we can shower others with the same LOVE that God has given to us.
- We can seek true JOY in something that lasts far longer than the newest thing we now desire.
- We can foster PEACE and allow our words to communicate this to others when meeting in person or using online platforms like Facebook.
- We can choose PATIENCE, even when the choice is hard.
- We can be an example of KINDNESS as we go through our day, for those nearest to us and for those who are simply in need.
- We can turn away from the opportunity to be sharp-tongued and offer GOODNESS for goodness' sake.
- We can sink our toes into the truth found in Scripture and let it fan the fire of FAITHFULNESS for us and our families.
- We can choose to let our responses to one another, be words of GENTLENESS especially if our day isn't going as planned.

And we can take a breath and use SELF-CONTROL even when (especially when) our emotions are out of control.

All of these gifts are given freely to us, not to be sought but to accept, as presents. These simple fruits are ours already. They bring to us what we need to faithfully live in the way God desires.

And as we unwrap each one daily, the things we wish to steer clear of become things we no longer seek. We will find ourselves "in step with the Spirit" in new ways.

Being conceited and argumentative and envious will have no room because our life will be filled with love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness and self-control.

Our lives will be overflowing with the very things that God desires for us most. And our words, our decisions, our day to day actions, will be

impacted in a way that others will see and want to duplicate.

Minute for Mission: WWJD? Here's One of the Church's Best Answers

The question "What would Jesus do?" often shortened to the acronym "W.W.J.D." has graced wrist bands, T-shirts, and bumper stickers since the 1990s. And while it might sound like an overused cliché, it's a question that can lead our spirit and, by extension, our lives to profound transformation.

What did Jesus do? He crossed a lot of boundaries. In fact, when we think about the boundaries that separate people—things like money, gender, education, culture, religion, and class—Jesus crossed them all.

He struck up a conversation with a Samaritan woman in a culture where it wasn't socially acceptable for men and women, much less Jews and Samaritans, to speak to one another. He healed the bodies and souls of people suffering from a variety of diseases when it was sinful to have anything to do with them. He visited the homes of tax collectors and sex trade workers and advocated for the rights of widows, orphans, and those living in poverty. He not only valued children in a time when they were considered such drains on society that they were abandoned on roadsides, but he also told his followers that unless they were more like children they wouldn't enter the kingdom of heaven.

In the same way, our generosity through <u>Mission & Service</u> breaks down walls that divide and builds bridges that draw us together.

Your generosity supports organizations like hospitals, counselling centres, drop-in circles, and homeless shelters that are there when people need them most. Your gifts sustain education programs that teach farming skills, provide job training, and help remove obstacles so children can remain in school. Your generosity stands up for victims of human trafficking, ensures workers and children know their rights, and advocates for those persecuted because of their sexual orientation, gender, or beliefs.
