From the minister's desk...

Revelation 21:4-5 (Good News Translation)

He will wipe away all tears from their eyes. There will be no more death, no more grief or crying or pain. The old things have disappeared."

Then the one who sits on the throne said, "And now I make all things new!" He also said to me, "Write this, because these words are true and can be trusted."

Thinking about 2020 makes me think of these verses. Over the last 20 years we have seen many of our ways of being the church slowly change. Our Sunday School rooms are no longer bursting with children. Our UCWs no longer have several Units. Sunday attendance isn't what it once was. Baptisms are fewer; as are church weddings and funerals. Many of the older hymns have been replaced with new ones. It's increasingly harder to find volunteers to assume positions of leadership (committee chairs, board/council chairs). Many have been saddened by these changes. Collectively we grieve the passing of a bustling church building.

Then, last March, we had to close the building down completely because of the danger of spreading Covid-19. We weren't allowed to congregate. Nor were we allowed to visit those who are shut in. We were left to wonder, without any worship or pastoral care how can we be the church?

Yes, the old ways disappeared. Yet the new ways actually serve more people. We started taping worship and putting it on YouTube. And people said that it was good. In fact, more people watch our services on their computers or TVs than came to church before the shutdown. For those who didn't have computers, we mailed out copies of the service (complete with words to the hymns). And people said that it was good. For pastoral care, phone calls were made and cards were sent. And people said that it was good. For meetings and Bible study and Messy Church we used Zoom. Okay, that might not be as good as meeting in person, but it did allow people to gather for a common purpose.

These methods of doing things have worked so well that we have

continued. The livestreaming equipment enables us to worship "together". And when the pandemic is over people will be able to continue worshipping with us in this way. I see it as a great thing for those who can't come because of health, mobility, or weather. Port Dover- Woodhouse Pastoral

Charge on YouTube is a new thing. It is a good thing.

Grace has formed an ad hoc committee that is exploring "new ways of being the church". Of course this, too, is another good thing. We are limited only by our imaginations.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation for all who have supported me with all of the changes and challenges through this past year. There is a song that goes, "The church is not a building. The

church is not a steeple. The church is not a resting place. The church is the people." The chorus starts, "I am the church. You are the church. We are the church together."




A message from the Church Out Serving:




