Message

The law was given through Moses.

Most of the 613 laws in the Old Testament are found in the Pentateuch (the first five books of the Bible) so most of them are from Moses. All sorts of laws about what you must do and what you are not to do. The people viewed these laws strictly. They believed that if you broke any, you must provide a "sin offering" to appease God. Their understanding of human relationship with God was all about abiding by the laws. God was about laws.

Then along came Jesus... the Word made flesh. God was "the Word". Now God came to the people as a human being. Jesus was about God's grace and truth. Those who would listen and believe learned so much about God. They learned that God was about so much more than laws. The truth is that God desires loving relationships that incorporate compassion, forgiveness, kindness, justice, humbleness.

I suspect that in the Jewish faith, some of those laws have been repealed over the centuries. I know that that is the case in the Christian tradition. For example, 1 Corinthians 14, verse 34, says "Women should remain silent in the churches. They are not allowed to speak, but must be in submission, as the law says." or 1 Timothy 2 verses 9 and 10 "I also want the women to dress modestly, with decency and propriety, adorning themselves, not with elaborate hairstyles or gold or pearls or expensive clothes, but with good deeds, appropriate for women who profess to worship God." Those two were from the Bible but there are innumerable "laws" that different denominations have instituted in the last two millennium and then repealed many. Remember the days when we were not allowed to do ANY work on Sunday? Jesus didn't say this. In fact he argued against the critics of his disciples who picked grain to eat on the sabbath. But even though the bible does not say that Jesus "forbade" working on Sundays, most of the Christian community made that a rule. I can remember my grandmother even preparing most of the Sunday dinner on Saturday. For most denominations, it is no longer an issue. People are encouraged to take Sabbath time, but it no longer must be on Sunday.

All sorts of "laws" or "rules" exist judging who is or is not a good Christian. Most of them have to do with sex or money. The United Church would not ordain people "regardless of sexual orientation" until 1988. Some denominations insist on tithing. I think that, gradually, these arbitrary rules are being corrected. I know that in the United Church they are. We have developed a practice of looking at things with the question, "Who is being excluded here?" I don't think that there are any denominations who haven't had past practices of exclusion. Some still do. But one or two hundred years is nothing in God's time and so, hopefully, those who still close their doors to some will ultimately open them. When I read the words of Jesus, that's the message I receive anyway.

Grace and truth through Jesus Christ. That's what John says. How wonderful it is to know that God's grace is available to everyone. We don't have to earn it or buy it with sacrifices. All we have to do to feel it is believe. And the truth is that God has only two laws: love God with all our being and love our neighbours as ourselves.

Yes, we need to have all sorts of laws to live together as a harmonious community. For example, I doubt that when Jesus lived there was any need for speed limits or the many other rules of the road. Nor would they have needed emission control laws. No best before or contents labels on food. No minimum wage. No telecommunication laws. Theirs was a different society with a need for their own set of rules. And I'm sure that they had some that were ridiculous just as we have. How do God's two laws include man's laws? If you think about our laws and respect the ones that exist to protect the well-being of all, it is loving your neighbour.

Moses' 613 laws may have been good for his time but, as we just celebrated last week, God came in the person of Jesus and we were given the greatest laws. Laws of love. With Jesus, we also received grace and truth.

During the coming season of Epiphany may the Spirit shine a light for us to see just who Jesus was and is in the history of our world and how we are called to follow him in ways of love and justice. Amen.
