Anthem

Message

Baptism is one of the two sacraments in the United Church. The other one is Communion.

In the first 2 centuries of the Common Era, adults converted to Christianity, pledged to remain sin-free, and were baptized. The baptism was said to wash away all pre-baptism sins. Then starting in the 3rd century, infants started to be baptized. This was when the concept of original sin was taught. Original sin is the sin of Adam and Eve and the doctrine is that we are all born with it. Then, for many centuries, it was taught that if one died without being baptized, they could not enter heaven. During the mid-twentieth century, that teaching was repealed. Thank goodness.

The other thing about baptism when it was first initiated as the way to join the Christian church was the teaching that, while baptism washed away the sins to date, any sins after baptism could not be forgiven. That one's gone too.

So what do we have today?

Some denominations don't believe in infant baptism. They have what is known as "believer baptism". Those churches usually have a large tank and persons are totally immersed in the water.

In churches where infants are baptized, the infants who are baptized obviously aren't able to make a choice. So their parents make promises to bring them up in the Christian faith and when the child is a teenager or beyond they take those promises on for themselves through Confirmation.

It is unrealistic to think or expect that a person would be able to remain sin-free, even after baptism. We're human. We mess up. Hopefully what does happen is that they recognize their sin, seek forgiveness, and continue to strive to do better. If we are serious about following Jesus, we will always do better. We will mess up less than if we are only concerned about ourselves.

Let's go back and look at John the Baptist and his baptism of Jesus. John was a humble Jewish prophet; sort of a modern day Elijah in his time. He preached for people to repent and also proclaimed the arrival of the Messiah, the kingdom of God. He taught that Jesus was greater than he was. Using a wedding analogy, it was like he was the best man and Jesus was the bridegroom.

Baptism was not something that started with John. It was a familiar ritual used when Gentiles converted to Judaism. It was, however, unusual for a Jew to be baptized. In the book of Acts, we hear an explanation that John's baptism looks ahead to the coming of the Messiah and Christian baptism looks back to the finished work of Christ.

You might wonder why Jesus insisted upon John baptizing him. After all, he is believed to be sin-free. Baptism was one way that he could identify with the sinners that he came to save. It was also the official start of his ministry.

Finally, John said that Jesus would baptize with the Holy Spirit. That happened at Pentecost. According to one of my commentaries, today, the minute a sinner trusts Christ, he or she is baptized by the Holy Spirit into the body of Christ. Of all the teachings about baptism, I think that I like that one best. With our religious ritual at baptism or confirmation, we ask a series of questions of the candidate's beliefs and intents. They, of course, give all the "right" answers. I can't see into their hearts so I have to trust that they understand and mean what they say. But Christ does look into our hearts and knows if we are sincere and are willing to take the step of trusting him. He knows if we are just fair-weather friends or if we're in it for the long haul. How about you?

Do you trust Christ?
What do you trust him to do?
I hope that you ponder those questions this week. Amen.

A Better World: One Water Project at a Time

According to UNICEF, more than half of the global population does not have access to safe sanitation and 2.2 billion people still lack access to safe drinking water.

Today—Baptism of Jesus Sunday—is a good day to consider our relationship with water.

How many Bible stories do you know have to do with water? Many of us have heard the story of Moses making water flow from rock and parting the Red Sea. We may remember stories about Jesus turning water into wine, walking on water, and calming it, too. So often, water is the focal point of God's miracles and grace. It figures prominently because it's necessary.

Clean water is essential to life, and yet around the world people suffer for lack of it.
