³ Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in

Christ. ⁴ For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love ⁵ he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will— ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace ⁸ that he lavished on us. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴ who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory.

Mark 6:14-29 New International Version John the Baptist Beheaded

¹⁴ King Herod heard about this, for Jesus' name had become well known. Some were saying, "John the Baptist has been raised from the dead, and that is why miraculous powers are at work in him."

And still others claimed, "He is a prophet, like one of the prophets of long ago."

¹⁵ Others said, "He is Elijah."

¹⁶ But when Herod heard this, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised from the dead!"

¹⁷ For Herod himself had given orders to have John arrested, and he had him bound and put in prison. He did this because of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, whom he had married. ¹⁸ For John had been saying to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." ¹⁹ So Herodias nursed a grudge against John and wanted to kill him. But she was not able to, ²⁰ because Herod feared John and protected him, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man. When Herod heard John, he was greatly puzzled; yet he liked to listen to him.

²¹ Finally the opportune time came. On his birthday Herod gave a banquet for his high officials and military commanders and the leading men of Galilee. ²² When the daughter of Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his dinner guests.

The king said to the girl, "Ask me for anything you want, and I'll give it to you." ²³ And he promised her with an oath, "Whatever you ask I will give you, up to half my kingdom."

- ²⁴ She went out and said to her mother, "What shall I ask for?" "The head of John the Baptist." she answered.
- ²⁵ At once the girl hurried in to the king with the request: "I want you to give me right now the head of John the Baptist on a platter."
- ²⁶ The king was greatly distressed, but because of his oaths and his dinner guests, he did not want to refuse her. ²⁷ So he immediately sent an executioner with orders to bring John's head. The man went, beheaded John in the prison, ²⁸ and brought back his head on a platter. He presented it to the girl, and she gave it to her mother. ²⁹ On hearing of this, John's disciples came and took his body and laid it in a tomb.

Message

Our gospel reading takes place right after Mark has told us about Jesus sending out his 12 disciples to teach and to heal (the scripture we heard last week). Herod wasn't Jewish, but he had already had experiences with one that he considered a Jewish holy man, John the Baptist. We heard today how he went against his own judgement and had John executed. Now there was this other man, this Jesus fellow, that people were saying was a prophet, or Elijah, or even John the Baptist come back to life. How troublesome that must have been for him. To have on his conscience what he knew was an unjust act and now he must have felt haunted by it.

John had made a profound impression on Herod.

I have some questions and some sample answers.

Who or what in your faith journey has made a profound impression on you?

Perhaps it was a Sunday School teacher or your Confirmation classes, maybe one of the ministers over the years, maybe times of prayer. When I was 13 we had an old Metro truck that kept breaking down and one day my mom had to use it to get some pigs to auction so we would have money for groceries. It was before seatbelts, so I was sitting on the engine cover and I prayed the whole trip there for God to keep that truck running. Well, we made it. The truck did not break down. I genuinely believed that God had answered my prayer. A couple of months later I was hanging some clothes on the line and there was something else that I wanted God to help with. But I realized that I hadn't thanked him for the last time. So I started my prayer with, "Thanks for keeping the truck running..." My faith has matured and my theology has changed over the years, so I'm probably inclined to agree with those who would call it a coincidence, but to the 13-year-old in me, that was God caring enough about us to make sure we got to the auction on time.

Maybe, like Herod, you just sensed God's presence at some time. When did you feel God's presence in the midst of joy or sorrow? In 2010 I was feeling very sad about something and I went to 5 Oaks for a couple of days to pray and reflect. I was walking the labyrinth and God sang to me. "Here I am; I have never left you. Take my hand; let me be your guide. Have no fear; I'm always with you. I'll never leave your side." God gave me the strength that I needed.

What have been the challenges, the times when you questioned your faith? What brought you through?

I never questioned the existence of God but there were some times when I was younger that I questioned if God really cared. I believe that it was going back to church that got me through. That assurance each week that God does really care. The stories of Jesus and his concern for the oppressed.

How does your faith bring you fulfillment in life?

This I can't articulate. I suppose in some ways it helps that I was away from church for a few years when I was younger. It gives me something to compare to. The feeling is so different.

If it weren't for the Covid restrictions, I would invite you to turn to the person next to you and tell them about a special moment in your faith journey. But some of those who are watching the service on YouTube are watching it alone as are some who get the printed copy and those who are attending the service at Woodhouse are having to sit too far apart. So I invite you to do some reflecting on it. Too often we just take it all for granted and forget those special moments. Maybe, if you are one who journals, you could write about a special moment or about some of the questions.

Let us pray: God, we thank you for revealing your love to us through Jesus Christ. Thank you for always being with us. Thank you for your grace. Amen.
