Minute for Mission 10 Million Signatures for Peace

Seventy years is enough. End the Korean War. That's the message of the recently launched global campaign called the Korea Peace Appeal.

The goal of the appeal is to collect 100 million signatures for peace by



2023, the 70th anniversary of the armistice. The ultimate goal is peace. The Korean War began in 1950. While open clashes ceased in 1953 with the signing of an armistice, a peace treaty has not yet been established and the war is not over. For more than 70 years the Korean people have endured a constant state of hostility and war, which has solidified the division of the peninsula.

For more than 30 years your gifts through Mission & Service have supported justice and peace work in Korea through the National Council of Churches in Korea (NCCK). The NCCK supports women's programs, human rights, and peace and reconciliation efforts. The NCCK has challenged The United Church of Canada to add 10,000 signatures to the Korea Peace Appeal by the summer of 2022. The

request is urgent. Please join the **Moderator** and others by adding your signature today.

"The point of the campaign is to urge an end to the Korean War and establish a peace agreement," says Patti Talbot, the United Church's team lead for global partnership.
