### Hebrews 5:1-10

Every high priest is selected from among the people and is appointed to represent the people in matters related to God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. <sup>2</sup> He is able to deal gently with those who are ignorant and are going astray, since he himself is subject to weakness. <sup>3</sup> This is why he has to offer sacrifices for his own sins, as well as for the sins of the people. <sup>4</sup> And no one takes this honor on himself, but he receives it when called by God, just as Aaron was.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> In the same way, Christ did not take on himself the glory of becoming a high priest. But God said to him, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father."

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>7</sup> During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. <sup>8</sup> Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he

suffered <sup>9</sup> and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him <sup>10</sup> and was designated by God to be high priest in the order of Melchizedek.

### Mark 10:35-45

- <sup>35</sup> Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."
- <sup>36</sup> "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.
- <sup>37</sup> They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."
- <sup>38</sup> "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"

  39 "We can," they answered.

Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with, <sup>40</sup> but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared."

# Message

So, James and John wanted to sit on each side of Jesus. That would have made one of them his "right-hand man". I've not heard of a "left-hand man", but presumably that position would yield as much power as the right hand. Power... the goal of so many people. Power can be a good thing or a bad thing, a life-giving thing or an evil thing. You've heard the expression, "money is power." That is true. The more money you have, the more influence you have. But it's not just money. Sometimes it is what a person does. You know, "so and so does this and

this and this and this. We'd be lost without them." Or a person has a position of influence. It could be political or corporate or even social. None of those things are bad. In fact, they can be very good...if they are used justly. If the influence is not used for one's own gain at the expense of others. The expense to others may be monetary but that is by no means the worst-case scenario.

For example, a person might use their social influence to exclude someone from activities which, by their nature, are open to a public sector. While the bully enjoys a sense of popularity and power, it can cost the excluded person their dignity, sense of self-worth, depression. Corporate power is something that exists in every organization. That power can be used to influence policies, sales, acquisitions, conditions of employment, transparency, salaries and bonuses, etc. We've heard about the price increases that have occurred during Covid. But some of those increases are the result of unwarranted price hikes. When it involves groceries, it makes it impossible for some people to feed their families adequately. Or what about the executives who got 6 or 7-digit bonuses last year when, at the same time, employees were laid off and financial bailout sought from the government. Or the Human Resource person who is secretly racist and makes sure that only certain people get hired.

I'm not even going to touch on the power that those with political influence have. We've all seen it.

The power of money! There is a lot that can be said about that. I'll take this opportunity to name one of my pet peeves. Payday Loans. These companies charge double digit interest rates. Yet their clients are people who are in a difficult position and really can't afford to be paying that kind of interest. The persons who established this business in the first place has used their financial power to increase their own position an outrageous cost to the more challenged in our society. Shame on them.

Don't get me wrong. I'm not saying that I believe that every politician,

corporate executive, or popular person is corrupt or abusive of their influence. Many are very good. Walter Gretzky used his social power to do a lot for young people. Bill Gates set up a foundation that provides money for a lot of good causes.

So, lets talk about power in a similar context to the Mark reading. In the church. Let's start with the minister. The minister can have a lot of power. I recognize that which is why I frequently remind myself that I serve God by serving you, not the other way around. Then there is your Council or Board. While they are accountable to you, they still have a fair bit of power over the day-to-day operation of the church. It is incumbent upon them to make decisions that are just. Next are committee members. Their time and talent are valued and appreciated. Like the minister and the Council or Board, they are serving God by serving the church. If any of the minister or volunteers takes the stand that if they don't get their own way on an issue they are "taking their bat and going home", they have moved from being a servant to wanting to be served. Some churches have congregants who take that stand. I'm glad that it's not the case here.

In conclusion I just want to repeat Jesus' words in verses 43 and 44 – "... whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all."

Amen.
