The Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language

being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? ⁹ Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" ¹² Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

Peter Addresses the Crowd

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: "Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! ¹⁶ No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

The Work of the Holy Spirit

²⁶ "When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the

Father—the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father—he will testify about me. ²⁷ And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning.

^{4b} I did not tell you this from the beginning because I was with you, ⁵ but now I am going to him who sent me. None of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' ⁶ Rather, you are filled with grief because I have said these things. ⁷ But very truly I tell you, it is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸ When he comes, he will prove the world to be in the wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹ about sin, because people do not believe in me; ¹⁰ about righteousness, because I am going to the Father, where you can see me no longer; ¹¹ and about judgment, because the prince of this world now stands condemned.

¹² "I have much more to say to you, more than you can now bear. ¹³ But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears,

when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. Anthem

Message

The readings today are about the coming of the Holy Spirit to the followers of Christ. We believe in a Triune God. That is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, 3 persons, yet one. The holy spirit is God's power in action, his active force. So what is the work of the Holy Spirit?

The first thing is that the Holy Spirit confirms our relationship with God. Listen as Paul explains it:

"The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children" (Romans 8:16).

"And you also were included in Christ when you heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory" (Ephesians 1:13-14). "This is how we know that we live in him and he in us: He has given us of his Spirit" (1 John 4:13).

Next the Holy Spirit helps us to pray. In Romans again, Paul says, "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God" (Romans 8:26-27).

Thirdly the Spirit helps us to understand scripture. "But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth" (John 16:13). Fourth, the Spirit helps us to overcome sin. To the Galatians Paul says, ""So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh" (Galatians 5:16).

Next, the Spirit gives us the boldness to witness to our faith. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

And the Holy Spirit transforms our characters. We hear in Glatians 5:22-23 "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law"

The traditional description of the Triune God, or "Trinity" as it is often referred to, is, as I said, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (or Holy Ghost). A newer description is Creator, Redeemer, and Sustainer. This is more descriptive of the function of each "person" of the Trinity. When you think about it, it makes sense. When we look around we can see

creation in plants, animals, water, humankind. God, the Creator... believing only in God, the Creator, doesn't require us to do anything for ourselves or anybody else or anything else. But it can also lead to an extremely lonely or miserable life. So let's add Jesus, the Redeemer to our beliefs. Jesus, Son of God, lived among us 2,000 years ago. There is lots of evidence of that. So Jesus taught us how to live in right relationship with God and all that God created. An important part of his teaching was forgiveness of sins. We are taught that Jesus died that we might be redeemed from our sins. If this is all we believe, we are really no further ahead than only believing in the Creator. We can go through life, doing as we please, with the attitude that it doesn't matter since all of our mistakes are forgiven anyway.

Being a Christian requires more. It requires belief in the third person of the Trinity...the Holy Spirit or the Sustainer. To sustain something takes some sort of action. The Holy Spirit is the energy that moves us into action. To maintain healthy relationships takes effort. The energy for that comes from the Spirit. Discerning what is right or wrong often takes deep thought or prayer. The Spirit helps with that. Speaking out against injustice can be scary. The Spirit gives us courage. The bottom line is that we need the Holy Spirit to be active within us if we are to follow Jesus. As a Christian we observe, we listen, and we respond. The Spirit is the energy for a Christian response. Amen.

Minute for Mission

Today's update and story is about how your Mission and Service dollars help groups, families and individuals locally.

Church Out Serving is a community-focused, faith-based charity serving Simcoe and surrounding Norfolk County.

Church Out Serving assists people in the community in many ways, but for today I would like touch on one specific situation that our Mission and Service Committee recently supported.

Church Out Serving has a small Benevolent Fund which they use to address specific needs of individuals. Recently, a single senior with multiple disabilities and no family, needed kitchen appliances and supplies.

Church Out Serving had been helping him by supplying fresh food and meals on a regular basis but since his living circumstances were complicated, he was not well equipped in his former apartment to eat well, even with donated food support. His fridge was not working, he had no microwave, few utensils, dishes or other supplies. His health was deteriorating. While he has been living with a physical disability for decades, in late April he fell and hit his head which resulted in a brain bleed requiring emergency surgery.

His recovery has progressed well but following the accident he was moved from his second story apartment into a new geared to income apartment on the main floor. This has already improved his mobility and health significantly. His new apartment has a working fridge and stove, but he was in need of most other kitchen supplies and necessities.

With a donation received from Grace United Church, Church Out Serving was able to equip him with some of these necessities, not only improving his ability to cook for and feed himself, but also helping him to regain some independence, dignity and comfort.

The Board of Church Out Serving is grateful to Grace United Church for their financial support and the support of volunteers.
